

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1 Only national university sports federation or any national organisation that is responsible for university sports in ASEAN countries are eligible to be represented in the ASEAN University Games (AUG).
- 1.2 Only the athletes who satisfy the following conditions may take part in AUG:
 - 1.2.1 Be a national of the country they represent.
 - 1.2.2 Be at least 18 and no older than 27 years of age on the 31st of December of the year of the AUG.* (Be born between 1 Jan 1999 and 31 Dec 2008).
 - 1.2.3a Be students who are currently officially registered in and proceeding towards the completion of a degree (either undergraduate or postgraduate) or diploma at the university or similar institute, the status of which is recognised by the appropriate national academic authority of their country.

Or
 - 1.2.3b Be former students of the institutions mentioned in 1.2.3a, who have obtained their academic degree or diploma in the calendar year preceding the event.

Note: Students reading International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma, GCE 'A' Level, foundation or pre-university programme of Diploma/Degree programme, other technical certifications not part of the Diploma/Degree programme, are not eligible.

(SHOOTING RULES)

2. TECHNICAL REGULATION

- 2.1 The AUG Shooting competition will be organised in accordance with:
 - 2.1.1 The AUG General Rules & Regulations.
 - 2.1.2 The current technical regulations of the International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF).

2.2 Equipment:

- 2.2.1 All weapons and other equipment such as jackets, trousers, gloves, shoes, and any accessories for Rifle athletes, as well as shoes and any accessories for Pistol athletes, to be used by shooters during competitions, must comply with the specifications set out in the latest International Shooting Sport Federation (ISSF) rules.
- 2.2.2 “Equipment Control” will be conducted daily before the competition at the shooting range, and each shooter must go through and obtain approval during this process before being allowed to participate in the event.

2.3 The competition will consist of the following 10 events:

2.3.2 Individual Event:

- 2.3.2.1 Each team is allowed to register a maximum of three (3) male participants and three (3) female participants for the contested 10 Meter Air Pistol and 10 Meter Air Rifle.

2.3.3 Team Event:

- 2.3.3.1 The three (3) participants competing in the individual event will automatically be considered as one (1) team for the team event.

2.3.4 Mixed Team Event:

- 2.3.4.1 Each team is allowed to register two (2) mixed team consisting of one (1) male participant and one (1) female participant for each team in the Mixed Team Air Pistol and Air Rifle events.

(SHOOTING RULES)

3. COMPETITION REGULATION

- 3.1 Individual Events Competition Format.
 - 3.1.1 The competition will last 1 hour and 15 minutes, and each shooter will be given 15 minutes for preparation and sighting before the competition begins.
 - 3.1.2 During the sighting period, shooters may fire an unlimited number of shots at the sighting target before shooting at the competition target.
 - 3.1.3 Each shooter must complete 60 shots on the competition target within the allotted time.
 - 3.1.4 Only the top eight (8) shooters will qualify for the final round after each qualification round has been completed.

- 3.2 Team Event Competition Format:
 - 3.2.1 For the Team Air Pistol & Air Rifle events, the total score of the three shooters from the same team will be counted to determine the winning team.

- 3.3 Mixed Team Event Competition Format:
 - 3.3.1 For the Mixed Team Air Pistol & Air Rifle events, the competition will last 30 minutes, and each shooter will be given 10 minutes for preparation and sighting before the competition begins.
 - 3.3.2 During the sighting period, shooters may fire an unlimited number of shots at the sighting target before shooting at the competition target.
 - 3.3.3 Each shooter must complete 30 shots on the competition target within the allotted time.
 - 3.3.4 Only the four (4) teams with the highest scores will qualify for the final round.

3. METHOD OF DETERMINING COMPETITION RESULTS

- 3.1 Method of Determining Results for Individual Events.
 - 3.1.1 To determine the results of the individual final event, shooters will be assigned to Firing Points A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H. The top eight (8) shooters based on scores from the qualification round will compete in the final.
 - 3.1.2 To determine the results of the individual event, shooters will fire 2 x 5 shot series according to instructions, followed by 2 single shots by command. The shooter with the lowest score will be eliminated after the 12th shot. Subsequent eliminations will occur every two (2) shots until the gold and silver medalists are determined. The total number of shots in the final round is twenty-four (24) shots..
 - 3.1.3 Elimination schedule:
 1. After the 12th shot – 8th place
 2. After the 14th shot – 7th place
 3. After the 16th shot – 6th place
 4. After the 18th shot – 5th place
 5. After the 20th shot – 4th place
 6. After the 22nd shot – 3rd place (bronze medalist)
 7. After the 24th shot – gold and silver medalists are determined
- 3.2 Method of Determining Results for Team Events.
 - 3.2.1 The scores of all three shooters in a team for each individual event during the qualification round will be combined to determine the winning team. Medal positions will be awarded based on the highest total team score.
- 3.3 Method of Determining Results for Mixed Team Events.
 - 3.2.1 For the final, teams are assigned to positions A-B/C-D/E-F/G-H according to a random draw.
 - 3.2.2 The final consist of all team members firing 3 x 5 shot series in 250 seconds on command, followed by 3 single shots on command in 50 seconds. The team with lowest accumulated score all this stage will be eliminated in 4th place. The remaining team members will fire a further 3 single shots on command in 50 seconds, with the lowest accumulated team score being awarded the Bronze medal. After a Further 3 single shots by all team members, Gold and Silver medals will be decided. A total of 24 shots will be fired by each team member winning gold and silver medals.

(SHOOTING RULES)

4. DELAY AND ABSENCE

- 4.1 For participants who arrive late, a grace period of 30 minutes after the start of the competition will be allowed to join. However, no additional time will be given for the event.
- 4.2 If the delay exceeds 30 minutes, the participant will automatically be disqualified from joining the competition.
- 4.3 Participants who are absent on the day of the competition will automatically be deemed ineligible to participate.
