SHOOTING RULES

1 TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

- 1.1 The AUG Shooting competition will be organised in accordance with:
- 1.1.1 The AUG General Rules & Regulations.
 - 1.1.2 The current technical regulations of the International Shooting Sports Federation (ISSF).

- 1.2 The competition will consist of the following:

- 1.3 Each country is authorised to enter:
- 1.3.1 A maximum of 4 men competitors, 4 women competitors and 3 team officials. Number of team officials shall not exceed number of competitors.
 - 1.3.2 Individual Events: Maximum of three (3) competitors per event.
 - 1.3.3 Men and Women Team Event: For each men and women team event, maximum of one (1) team of three (3) competitors participate as one (1) team in team events.
 - 1.3.4 Mixed Team Event: For each mixed team, maximum of one (1) team of two (2) competitors consists of one (1) male participant and one (1) female participant.

- 1.1 Countries must confirm and submit their list of competitors at the General Technical Meeting.

2 COMPETITION REGULATIONS

- 2.1 Men's Air Pistol and Air Rifle
- 2.1.1 Air Pistol will take 1 hour and 30 minutes and 1 hour and 15 minutes for the Air Rifle.

- 2.1.2 Every shooter will be given 60 competition target paper and 4 sighting target.
- 2.1.3 Every shooter will be given 15 minutes to prepare themselves and shoot the sighting target (preparation and sighting period) before the competition starts.
- 2.1.4 For the sighting target, the shooters are allowed to shoot unlimited before shoot to the competition target paper.
- 2.1.5 Eight (8) best shooter in the qualifying round will qualify to the final round.
- 2.2 Women's Air Pistol and Air Rifle
 - 2.2.1 Air Pistol will take 60 minutes and 50 minutes for the Air Rifle.
 - 2.2.2 Every shooter will be given 40 competition target paper and 4 sighting target.
 - 2.2.3 Every shooter will be given 15 minutes to prepare themselves and shoot the sighting target (preparation and sighting period) before the competition starts.
 - 2.2.4 For the sighting target, the shooters are allowed to shoot unlimited before shoot to the competition target paper.
 - 2.2.5 Eight (8) best shooter in the qualifying round will qualify to the final round.
- 2.3 Equipment & Attire
 - 2.3.1 Each weapon and other equipment such as jackets, pants, gloves, shoes and any accessories for the athlete's rifle footwear.
 - 2.3.2 Pistol to be used by shooters during the competition shall follow the specification ruled by ISSF.
 - 2.3.3 Equipment Control will be held the day before the tournament takes place in shooting range and every shooter needs to get an approval during this process before being allowed to enter the competition.
- 2.4 Match Attire

The attire of participants must comply with ISSF standard.

3 METHOD OF DETERMINING COMPETITION RESULTS

- 3.1 Method of Determining Results for Individual Events.
 - 3.1.1 To determine the results of the individual final event, shooters will be assigned to Firing Points A, B, C, D, E, F, G, H. The top eight (8) shooters based on scores from the qualification round will compete in the final.
 - 3.1.2 To determine the results of the individual event, shooters will fire 2 x 5 shot series according to instructions, followed by 2 single shots by command. The shooter with the lowest score will

be eliminated after the 12th shot. Subsequent eliminations will occur every two (2) shots until the gold and silver medallists are determined. The total number of shots in the final round is twenty-four (24) shots.

3.1.3 Elimination schedule:

- i. After the 12th shot – 8th place
- ii. After the 14th shot – 7th place
- iii. After the 16th shot – 6th place
- iv. After the 18th shot – 5th place
- v. After the 20th shot – 4th place
- vi. After the 22nd shot – 3rd place (bronze medallist)
- vii. After the 24th shot – gold and silver medallists are determined

3.2 Method of Determining Results for Team Events.

3.2.1 The scores of all three shooters in a team for each individual event during the qualification round will be combined to determine the winning team. Medal positions will be awarded based on the highest total team score.

3.3 Method of Determining Results for Mixed Team Events.

3.2.1 For the final, teams are assigned to positions A-B/C-D/E-F/G-H according to a random draw.

3.2.2 The final consists of all team members firing 3 x 5 shot series in 250 seconds on command, followed by 3 single shots on command in 50 seconds. The team with lowest accumulated score all this stage will be eliminated in 4th place. The remaining team members will fire a further 3 single shots on command in 50 seconds, with the lowest accumulated team score being awarded the bronze medal. After a Further 3 single shots by all team members, gold and silver medals will be decided. A total of 24 shots will be fired by each team member winning gold and silver medals.
